He has served as President of the Association for Research in Otolaryngology and the American Otological Society, and as a member of the National Deafness and Other Communication



Disorders Advisory Council. Dr. Carey holds primary and neurotology subspecialty certifications with the American Board of Otolaryngology – Head and Neck Surgery.
